Frequently Asked Questions

1. How do I apply to the Internal Medicine Residency Program?

Please submit your application through ERAS using our Number (#140-35-21-301). We only participate through **The Match.**

2. What is the number of available positions in your residency program?

The numbers of positions within the residency program are: Preliminary 19 and Categorical 42.

3. Do you sponsor any international visas?

Yes, we sponsor J1 and H1b visas. Applicants must have Step 3 before *The Match Day* for the H1b visa.

4. What are the required documents for applying to our program?

- ERAS common application form
- Dean's Letter
- Minimum of three Letters of Recommendations.
- Official Medical School Transcript
- USMLE Transcripts

5. What is your minimum score for USMLE Step 1 and Step 2 (CK & CS)?

- While we do not have minimum score requirements for the USMLE, the average score for the candidates who successfully match with us is 240 for Step 1 and 241 for Step 2. First attempt only.
- The Comlex score for most of the Osteopathic that match with us is more than 600 for levels 1 and 2.

6. When do you begin reviewing applications?

We start reviewing applications in mid-September

7. What are the starting dates of the Residency Program?

The starting date for Preliminary Interns is June 17, 2017 The starting date for the Categorical is July 1, 2017

8. What is the deadline to apply to the Internal Medicine Residency Program? January 2, 2017

9. Is there a cutoff date after graduating medical school?

We review all applications and evaluate the applicant in accordance to their academic transcripts, board scores, letters of recommendations, etc.

10. What is a Primary Care Track?

11. Is there any clinical experience required?

For International Medical Graduates, clinical experience within the past two years is desired. An ECFMG certification by the time of interview is helpful but not required. Typically, 1-3 months of United States clinical experience is encouraged. Having more US clinical experience will not increase your chance for an interview.
