Program Overview

This program will bring together health professionals, legal experts, and journalists, as well as responders and survivors of September 11, 2001. Thursday morning will highlight the health effects of toxins at the World Trade Center, the Pentagon, and the Shanksville crash site and the life-saving medical monitoring and treatment services provided through the WTC Health Program. Thursday afternoon, there will be a discussion about the evolution of the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund (VCF). Friday will gather advocates and the journalists who covered their efforts to pass the James Zadroga 9/11 Health and Compensation Act in 2010, with reauthorization of the WTC Health Program in 2015 and reauthorization of the VCF in 2019.
