In 2025, Mount Sinai Health System saw an annual volume of **~600k emergency visits**, across **7 Emergency Departments**. Complementing this, the **Mount Sinai Virtual Urgent Care** program saw **~10k telemedicine visits**. Our care team includes over 240 emergency medicine physicians, 100 physician assistants, 700 emergency nursing team members, and an array of administrative employees.



As of 2025, all Mount Sinai Health System Emergency Departments achieved **Lantern Award** status by the **Emergency Nurses Association**, a testament to the dedication, skill, and compassion of our emergency nurses.



In April, **Mount Sinai South Nassau** completed the \$50 million five year renovation of the **Fennessy Family Emergency Department** which doubles the available clinical footprint and capacity. In November, Mount Sinai South Nassau went live with Epic, a major milestone in bringing standardized care across Mount Sinai Health System.



In May, with the support of an anonymous donor, **Mount Sinai Emergency Medicine Residents** attended and presented at the **Society for Academic Emergency Medicine (SAEM)**, which brings together experts, sharing research, best practices, and ongoing advances in emergency medicine.



In 2025, the **Emergency Medicine Student Clerkship** was **ranked #1** in the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai for the 10th time, the only department to do since clerkships were rated.



In September, **The Mount Sinai Hospital** announced the completion of a major, six-phase redesign project of its **Saul Family Emergency Department** that provides more clinical space, a completely renovated observation unit, and a more private and comfortable experience for patients.



In 2025, led by the **Evidence Based Practice** committee, Emergency Medicine launched five **AgileMD Clinical Pathways**, which will streamline workflows for providers, strengthen collaboration, and promote high-quality, standardized, and equitable care at all Mount Sinai Emergency Departments.



Jared M. Kutzin, DNP, MS, MPH, RN, Professor of Emergency Medicine and the Senior Director of the Simulation Teaching and Research (STAR) Center at The Mount Sinai Hospital, was named President of the Society for Simulation in Healthcare (SSH).



Deborah Dean, MD, Associate Professor of Emergency Medicine and Vice Chair of Quality, Safety, and Patient Experience for Emergency Medicine, received the Robin Chemers Neustein Mid-Career Program award, sponsored by the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai.

Jamie Forbes, MBA, SHRM-CP, Manager of People Operations for Emergency Medicine, received the Volunteer Champion Award from Futures and Options.

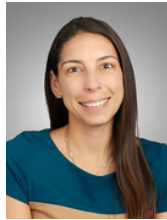

In October, Mount Sinai hosted the annual **Emergency Alumni Awards**, celebrating residency alumni.



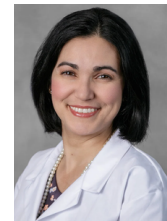
