“Does the Truth Matter in Supreme Court Bioethics Cases?”

Professor Kolber writes and teaches in the areas of health law, bioethics, criminal law, and neuroethics. In 2005, he created the Neuroethics & Law Blog and, in 2006, taught the first law school course devoted to law and neuroscience. He has also taught law and neuroscience topics to federal and state judges as part of a MacArthur Foundation grant. His work has been frequently discussed in the media, including the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, and USA Today.
