

Introduction

In June 2024, an online survey was implemented in the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai (Icahn Mount Sinai) to collect information on issues related to sexual misconduct and assault. The New York State "Enough is Enough" statute (NYS 129-B) requires the implementation of a campus climate assessment every other year. The survey was sent to all students enrolled at Icahn Mount Sinai during Spring 2024. In total, the survey was sent to 1,241 students. The response rate for the survey was 6%.

Students received the link to the online survey via their Mount Sinai email and were told the survey would take 10-20 minutes to complete. Because of the sensitive nature of the information being collected, confidentiality was a priority, and responses were not linked to any individuals.


Results


Demographic Information (n=74)

- 45% Medical School | 51% Graduate School | 4% Prefer Not to Answer
- 63% in first or second year
- 44% 25 year old or younger
- 55% female | 34% male
- 49% White | 32% Asian | 11% Black or African American | 8% Hispanic
 7% prefer not to answer
- 72% heterosexual
- 53% live in Aron Hall
- 68% never married | 17% currently married



Perceptions of Campus Climate










Student Experiences

- 90% responded that they have experienced zero incidents of unwanted sexual contact, 8% said one, and 2% preferred not to answer
- 9% responded that since the start of the academic year they have had a friend tell them they had an unwanted sexual experience
- 94% responded "Yes" when asked about knowing how to access resources (mental health and counseling services)
- 71% Agreed or Strongly Agreed with knowing where to find confidential support
