

MEDICAL STUDENT PROTOCOL

Needlestick / Puncture Wound / Splash / or Bodily Fluid Exposure (BBFE)

In the event that a **MEDICAL STUDENT** is exposed to blood or bodily fluid:

WASH	Wash exposed area with soap and water. If a mucous membrane exposure (eyes, nose, mouth), flush with water.
REPORT	Report to Nurse Manager (D) / Nurse Administrator (E/H/W) on unit where the exposure occurred. • Complete an Accident/Injury Report and initiate source patient testing For assistance reaching the Nurse Manager/Nurse Administrator at MSH main campus, dial "O"
VISIT	If you are at MSH Main Campus, present for immediate evaluation: • ISMMS Students at MSH main: - M-F 9-4, ID in CAM 17 E 102nd St, 3rd floor - All other times: go directly to the Emergency Department (ED) • Visiting Students at MSH main: Go directly to the Emergency Department (ED) If you are rotating offsite, please see below
CONTACT	Contact the Student Health Center (SHC) to report your case and for follow up 17 East 102 St., 4 th floor, Room D4-246, (212) 241-6023 or studenthealth@mssm.edu Bring a copy of your Discharge/Visit Summary Report to your visit
FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY	Care related to an exposure is a non-billable service for students. ISMMS Students should <u>not</u> provide any insurance information for their visits to the emergency room or any other care environment related to the protocol.

Potentially Infectious body fluids include:

Blood / cerebrospinal fluid / pleural fluid / pericardial fluid / peritoneal fluid / amniotic fluid / synovial fluid / semen / vaginal secretions / any visibly bloody fluid / unfixed or under fixed tissues

Vomit, saliva, nasal secretions, sputum, tears, sweat, urine and feces are <u>not</u> considered infectious <u>unless</u> visibly contaminated with blood.
