Service to Patients and theiir Families: "I was firsthand witness to David exemplifying outstanding leadership qualities and clinical acumen during an emergency at the Starbucks in the Guggenheim Pavilion lobby. He responded to a person choking on food in the outdoor seating area and the patient was found to be unconscious upon arrival. He immediately activated the cardiac arrest team and started coordinating the roles for running the cardiac arrest. Due to his leadership, we were able to get ROSC and the patient was treated in the MICU afterward. He spent time with the family after this event and explained what had happened and provided answers to any questions they had. He would check on the patient daily while in the hospital and connect with the family in this difficult time. This is only one example of many of his outstanding service to patients and their families. Secondly, David acts as a mentor for his peers within the internal medicine residency. As a former resident, he regularly is in contact with internal medicine residents who are interested in cardiology and mentors them on research projects related to interventional cardiology. He is an example of a devoted and relentless fellow who strives to help others become successful."
