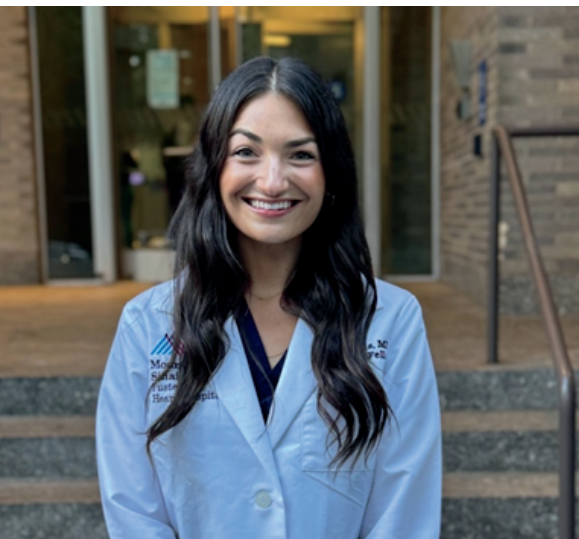
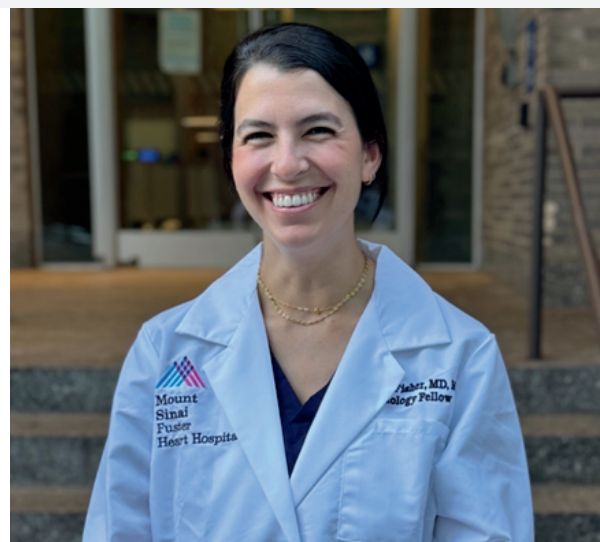


Tristan Alfie, MD

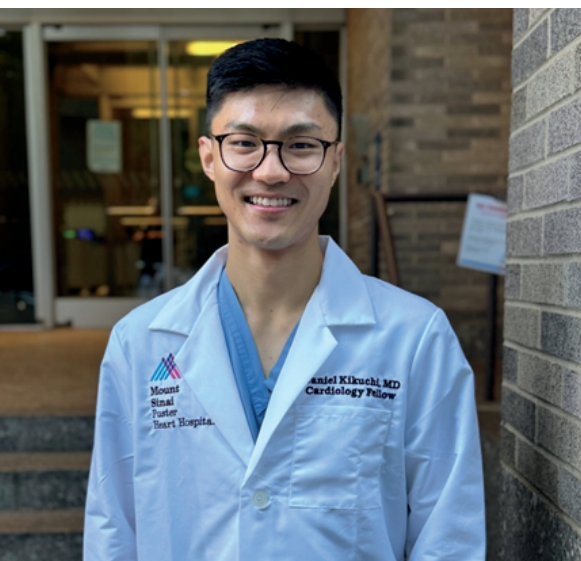
Rebecca Fisher, MD

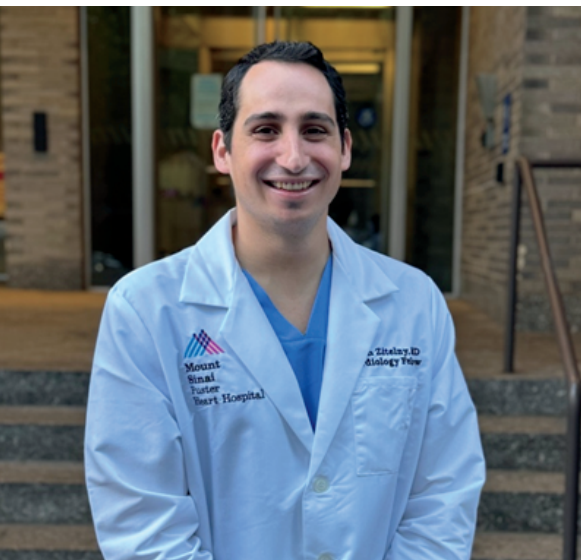


Daniel Kikuchi, MD

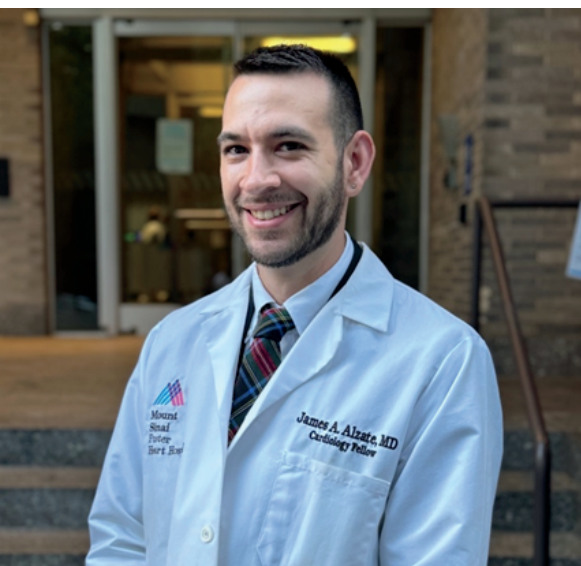
Anna Radakrishnan, MD

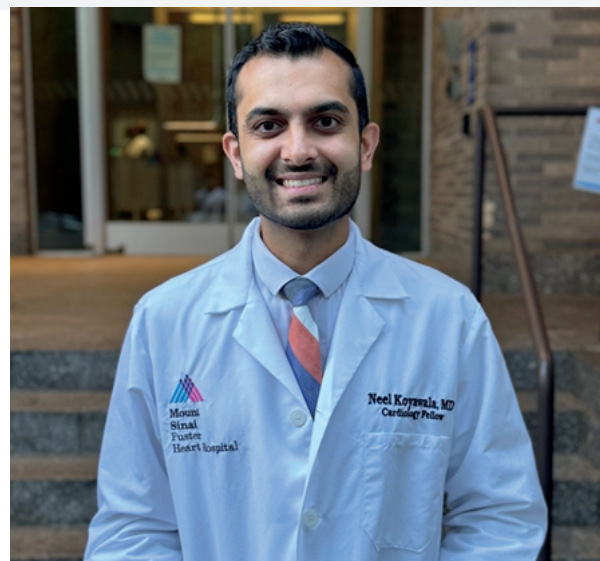


James Alzate, MD

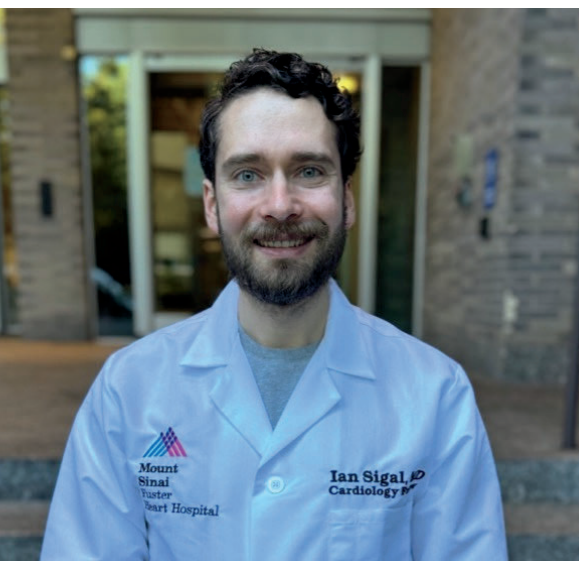
Neel Koyawala, MD

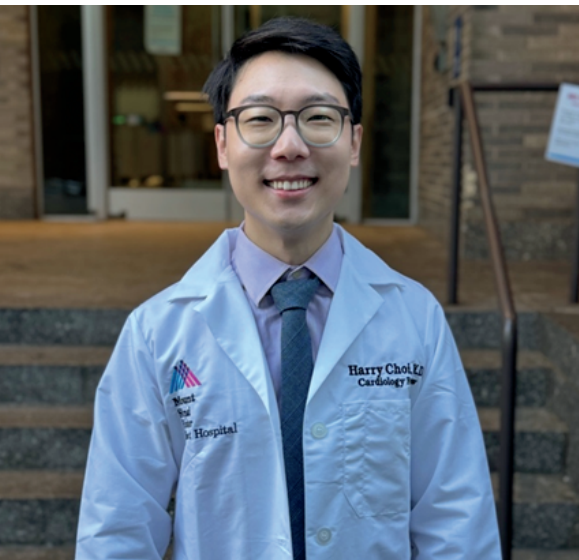
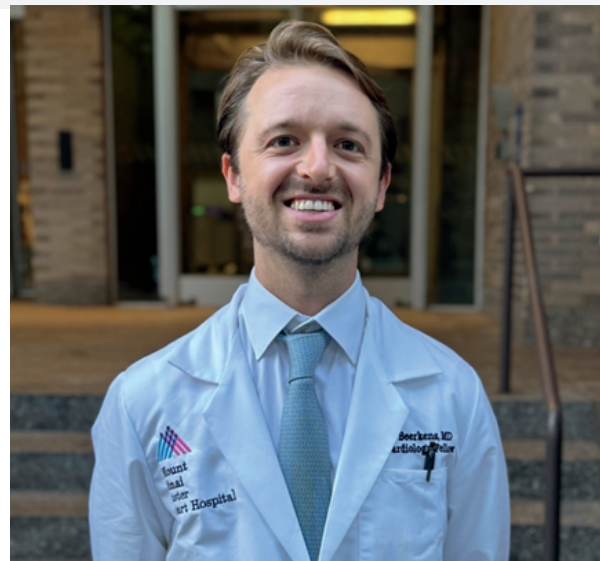


Oludamilola “Dami” Akinmolayemi, MD

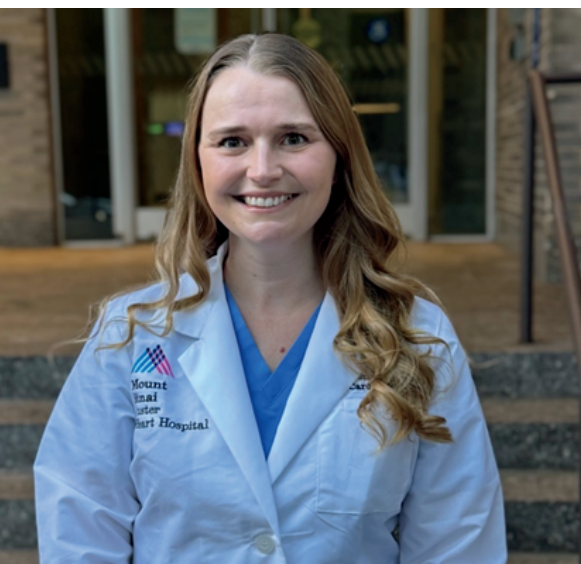
Frans Beerkens, MD, PhD (Chief Fellow)
