Service to patients and/or families: "Already a few hours into the worldwide CrowdStrike server outage, I returned to the intern work room to place admission orders at one of the few computers that was still online. Our patient's morning labs had just returned, revealing a frightening new lactate more than 5 times the upper limit of normal. When I told Karim he sprang into action and we returned to the ED. Although the patient looked remarkably well, Karim was concerned and started expediting diagnostics. Due to the server outages, imaging orders were no longer showing up on the radiology scheduling software. Karim got on the phone with both the overnight radiologist and the CT technicians to ensure we could proceed, before physically wheeling the patient to the CT suite. Through impressive inter-departmental teamwork, our patient underwent IR thrombectomy that morning despite system-wide delays during the CrowdStrike outage. It was Karim's heroic leadership under challenging circumstances that allowed us to swiftly diagnose and treat our patient's acute ischemic enterocolitis. One day when I am a senior resident, I can only hope to be nearly as inquisitive, perceptive, and calm under pressure as Karim."

Service to patients and/or families;: "Lauren went above and beyond for one of our patients. She helped to arrange a multi-disciplinary meeting to help address all of the patient's needs and ultimately got the patient the care that she needed. Lauren also selflessly made herself available to the patient and her family and became the patient's strongest advocate. This particular patient had previous negative interactions with the healthcare system but Lauren patiently worked on her timeline and gained her trust by showing her that there were people in her corner. It was a perfect example of how we should meet patients where they are at and understand that what we see is just a small snapshot of their lives. In the few weeks since I started fellowship, I have seen Lauren extend herself beyond what is required of her in order to meet the needs of our patients but I was particularly impressed with the empathy and grace Lauren showed this patient."
