
The Dean's Office GCO released guidance several weeks ago regarding disclosing overlap.

NIH Other Support: Overlap Guidance (Dean's Office/GCO)

We wanted to highlight this statement here:

"Individuals submitting grants with overlap and failing to acknowledge such during the submission process (InfoEd submission) are subject to sanctions by NIH for Failure to Disclose."

And we thought it would be helpful to point you to where exactly you are disclosing this. Please see this question on the NIH 424 Cover Sheet.



Below are the corresponding instructions from the <u>SF424 (R&R Application Guide</u>.

In the field "Is this application being submitted to other agencies?" check "Yes" if one or more of the specific aims submitted in your application is also contained in a similar, identical, or essentially identical application submitted to another federal agency. Otherwise, check "No." If you checked "Yes," indicate the agency or agencies to which the application has been submitted.

The GCO would also like to reiterate that submitting to multiple funding agencies is both fine and expected. This information; however, must be disclosed properly.
