


# Getting Children Back to School and Childcare Centers Quickly and Safely After A Hurricane




## CLEAN UP

Children, adolescents, and pregnant women should not help with clean up. Toxic exposures can be more dangerous for them.



## BUILDINGS & PLAY SPACES

Repair or remove loose, sharp, or damaged materials.



## GETTING TO SCHOOL

Check to see that routes to school are intact and free of loose electrical lines and other dangers.



## AIR QUALITY

Safely store cleaning products and paints. Move generators outdoors and away from open windows, doors, and vents.



## WATER DAMAGE & MOLD

Make sure everything inside is dry and that leaks are fixed. Check to see that mold has been removed.



## DRINKING WATER

Shut off valves to water fountains and sinks until certified safe by officials.
