

Breakthrough Award – Pre-application's due June 8 for levels 1 & 2, June 9 for levels 3 & 4; Level 1 & 2 full application due June 15, Level 3 & 4 full application due August 31

- Investigators at all academic levels (or equivalent)
- Senior postdoctoral fellows who do not meet the eligibility requirements of the Breakthrough Fellowship Award are encouraged to apply under Funding Levels 1 and 2



Supports promising research that has the potential to lead to or make breakthroughs in breast cancer.

- Potential impact of the research may be near-term or long-term, but it must be significant and go beyond an incremental advancement.
- Partnering PI Option allows two Principal Investigators (PIs), termed Initiating and Partnering PIs, to collaborate on a single application.
- Four different funding levels, based on the scope of research, are available. It is the responsibility of the PI to select the funding level that is most appropriate for the research proposed. The funding level should be selected based on the scope of the research project, rather than the amount of the budget.

The following are general descriptions, although not all-inclusive, of the scope of research projects that would be appropriate to propose under each funding level:

- **Funding Level 1:** Innovative, high-risk/high-reward research that is in the earliest stages of idea development. Research with potential to yield new avenues of investigation. Proof of concept. No preliminary data required.

- Funding Level 4: Large-scale projects that will transform and revolutionize the clinical management and/or prevention of breast cancer. Near-term clinical impact is expected. Human clinical testing is required. Pls are expected to have experience in successfully leading large-scale projects.

Funding Levels 1 and 2:


- Submission of a Letter of Intent is required prior to full application submission.
- Each PI may submit only one application as a PI or Initiating PI. There are no limitations on the number of applications for which an investigator may be named as a Partnering PI. - Additional funds are available for applications submitted under the Partnering PI Option.
- Clinical trials are not allowed.

- Clinical trials are allowed.
- Each PI may submit only one application as a PI or Initiating PI. There are no limitations on the number of applications for which an investigator may be named as a Partnering PI. However, applicants are discouraged from submitting as a Partnering PI on multiple applications unless they are clearly unique, meaningful collaborations addressing distinct research questions.

PIs must include two or more breast cancer advocates on their research team







Advances in cancer research often originate from innovative thinking and ingenious approaches. Securing funding for these truly out-of-the-box ideas remains a challenge, especially for early career scientists.

The Damon Runyon-Rachleff Innovation Award provides support for the next generation of exceptionally creative thinkers with "high-risk/high-reward" ideas that have the potential to significantly impact our understanding of and/or approaches to the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of cancer. This award is specifically designed to provide funding for extraordinary early career researchers who have an innovative, new idea but lack sufficient preliminary data to obtain traditional funding. The research supported by the award must be novel, exceptionally creative and, if successful, have the strong potential for high impact in the cancer field.

The PCC is an anti-doping research collaborative which supports the scientific advancement of anti-doping technology through grant funding.

Who may apply:

The PCC supports investigators **world-wide** whose scientific research has the potential for meaningful contribution to the detection or deterrence of performance enhancing drug use, and the protection of clean athletes. Previous grants have been awarded to both anti-doping scientists and those outside the field interested in contributing their acumen to solving pervasive anti-doping challenges. Past recipients hail from academia, industry, and/or research laboratories.

<u>The PCC Fellowship Program</u> specifically seeks young PhDs looking to explore a career track in anti-doping through expert mentorship and real-world experience in a WADA-Accredited laboratory. The program offers \$150,000 over two years to support accepted candidates.

Eligible Projects:

Projects discovering less expensive or less invasive sample collection methods, improving current detection methods, and/or detecting designer substances are all excellent candidates for PCC funding. However, all high quality scientific projects which move the anti-doping movement forward will be considered. There are no formal funding limits; however, all budget items must be justified to result in a recommendation for funding. The average amount of a PCC award is \$202,000 USD.

The Simons Foundation Autism Research Initiative (<u>SFARI</u>) is pleased to announce the <u>2017</u> Bridge to Independence Award request for applications (RFA).

Grants awarded through this program are intended to invest in the next generation of top autism investigators by identifying talented early-career scientists interested in autism research and facilitating their transition to independent research careers.

One of the most salient milestones in a scientific career is the transition from formal mentorship to an independent position. Unfortunately, this transition has become increasingly tenuous in recent years, in part because of the decreasing number of tenure-track faculty positions, which has been compounded by the increasing number of Ph.D. graduates and postgraduate traineeships. SFARI created the Bridge to Independence Award program to address this issue and to encourage continued excellence in the autism research field.
