**Breakthrough Award – Pre-application’s due June 8 for levels 1 & 2, June 9 for levels 3 & 4; Level 1 & 2 full application due June 15, Level 3 & 4 full application due August 31**

- Investigators at all academic levels (or equivalent)
- Senior postdoctoral fellows who do not meet the eligibility requirements of the Breakthrough Fellowship Award are encouraged to apply under Funding Levels 1 and 2

Supports promising research that has the potential to lead to or make breakthroughs in breast cancer.

- Potential impact of the research may be near-term or long-term, but it must be significant and go beyond an incremental advancement.
- Partnering PI Option allows two Principal Investigators (PIs), termed Initiating and Partnering PIs, to collaborate on a single application.

#### **Funding Levels 1 and 2:**

- Submission of a Letter of Intent is required prior to full application submission.
- Each PI may submit only one application as a PI or Initiating PI. There are no limitations on the number of applications for which an investigator may be named as a Partnering PI. Advances in cancer research often originate from innovative thinking and ingenious approaches. Securing funding for these truly out-of-the-box ideas remains a challenge, especially for early career scientists.

The Damon Runyon-Rachleff Innovation Award provides support for the next generation of exceptionally creative thinkers with "high-risk/high-reward" ideas that have the potential to significantly impact our understanding of and/or approaches to the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of cancer. This award is specifically designed to provide funding for extraordinary early career researchers who have an innovative, new idea but lack sufficient preliminary data to obtain traditional funding. The research supported by the award must be novel, exceptionally creative and, if successful, have the strong potential for high impact in the cancer field.

Eligible applicants (including non-U.S. citizens) must be conducting independent research at a U.S. institution. Institutional nominations are not required and there is no limit to the number of applications that can be received from a particular institution. Basic and translational/clinical projects will be considered and individuals with a background in multiple disciplines are especially encouraged to apply.

The initial award will be for two years, \$150,000 per year (\$300,000 total), with the opportunity for up to two additional years of funding (up to four years total for \$600,000). #### Who may apply:

The PCC supports investigators **world-wide** whose scientific research has the potential for meaningful contribution to the detection or deterrence of performance enhancing drug use, and the protection of clean athletes. Previous grants have been awarded to both anti-doping scientists and those outside the field interested in contributing their acumen to solving pervasive anti-doping challenges. Past recipients hail from academia, industry, and/or research laboratories.

[The PCC Fellowship Program](#) specifically seeks young PhDs looking to explore a career track in anti-doping through expert mentorship and real-world experience in a WADA-Accredited laboratory. The program offers \$150,000 over two years to support accepted candidates.

#### Eligible Projects:

Projects discovering less expensive or less invasive sample collection methods, improving current detection methods, and/or detecting designer substances are all excellent candidates for PCC funding. However, all high quality scientific projects which move the anti-doping movement forward will be considered. There are no formal funding limits; however, all budget items must be justified to result in a recommendation for funding. The average amount of a PCC award is \$202,000 USD.

Grants awarded through this program are intended to invest in the next generation of top autism investigators by identifying talented early-career scientists interested in autism research and facilitating their transition to independent research careers.

One of the most salient milestones in a scientific career is the transition from formal mentorship to an independent position. 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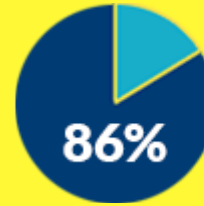

#### About the Award

The Investigators in the Pathogenesis of Infectious Disease (PATH) award provides \$500,000 over five years to support accomplished investigators at the assistant professor level to study pathogenesis, with a focus on the interplay between human and microbial biology, shedding light on how human and microbial systems are affected by their encounters.

#### Details

The Investigators in the Pathogenesis of Infectious Disease program provides opportunities for assistant professors to bring multidisciplinary approaches to the study of human infectious diseases. The goal of the program is to provide opportunities for accomplished investigators still early in their careers to study what happens at the points where the systems of humans and potentially infectious agents connect. The program supports research that sheds light on the fundamentals that affect the outcomes of these encounters: how colonization, infection, commensalism, and other relationships play out at levels ranging from molecular interactions to systemic ones.

PATH is a highly competitive award program that provides \$500,000 over a period of five years to assistant professors. The awards are intended to give recipients the freedom and flexibility to pursue new avenues of inquiry, stimulating higher risk research projects that hold potential for significantly advancing understanding of how infectious diseases work and how health is maintained.

### Eligibility

The competition will employ a two-stage process. After review of pre-proposals, full proposal invitations will be sent by October 2, 2017.

All applicants will be required to complete a web-based questionnaire assessing their eligibility to apply for this award. If eligibility criteria are met, applicants will be automatically directed to the web-based pre-proposal application.


